The purpose of this program is to provide updated information regarding diagnosis and management of conditions affecting the head and neck. The program will consist of clinical differential diagnosis and management of case studies demonstrating both common and unusual conditions. This program will provide foundational knowledge as well as a critical thinking approach to diagnosis and management.

At the completion of this presentation, participants should be able to:

- ◆ Know the cause, pathogenesis, historical features, signs, symptoms, laboratory abnormalities, radiographic findings (where applicable), and recommended initial management of the most common and/or serious diseases and lesions of the oral and maxillofacial region;
- ◆ Use critical thinking and problem-solving skills to formulate a clinical differential diagnosis and recommend initial management for patients with oral diseases;
- ◆ Classify lesions and diseases of the oral and maxillofacial region into clinical categories using a clinical flowchart (decision tree) and use the flowchart to formulate a differential diagnosis; and
- ◆ Manage patients with complex orofacial problems in conjunction with other health care providers.

Dental patients ingest and are exposed to many chemicals on a daily basis. During this program we will explore intra-oral effects of these chemicals and learn how to recognize common culprits. We will also examine the most effective treatments for mucositis with emphasis on using what is inexpensive and easy FIRST! Finally, we will discuss recognition and treatment challenges involving patients with current or past substance abuse issues.

At the completion of this presentation, participants should be able to:

- ◆ List common ingredients in dental products that can worsen oral mucositis;
- ◆ Recommend specific oral health products for patients with chronic mucositis;
- ◆ Prescribe effective topical and systemic treatments for oral mucositis;
- ◆ Recognize the signs and symptoms of recent methamphetamine, cocaine, ecstasy, marijuana, or opioid abuse; and
- ◆ Modify or delay dental treatment for active substance abuse patients in order to safely manage their oral health needs.

Karen Baker, R.Ph., M.S. Pharm., Associate Professor, Department of Oral Pathology, Radiology and Medicine, College of Dentistry. Professor Baker has been on the Dental College faculty at The University of Iowa for 30 years and occupies a unique role in dental practice and education. She is a clinical pharmacist with a Master's degree in clinical pharmacology and therapeutics and is focused on patient-specific dental drug therapy. She has given over 800 programs nationally and internationally and holds memberships in many dental and clinical pharmacology and therapeutics organizations. Professor Baker is on the editorial board of the *Journal of the Academy of General Dentistry*. Her dental education-based pharmacy and drug therapy consultation center is the only one in the United States. She has authored more than 50 articles and abstracts and lectures extensively in pre-doctoral and graduate-level courses at The University of Iowa.
