PRESENTATION OF CASES – JUNE, 2010

*Course will be presented by faculty in the
Department of Endodontics*

Friday, January 8, 2010 – Day 1: The purpose of Day 1 is to expand the knowledge base of endodontic treatment for general practitioners performing endodontic treatment. Areas of concentrated study include diagnosis and treatment, managing urgent/emergent patients, and non-surgical root canal treatment. New endodontic instruments, materials and techniques will be discussed in relationship to enhancing treatment outcomes.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this day, participants should be able to:

- Describe diagnostic techniques in endodontics;
- Discuss current instruments, materials, and techniques utilized in non-surgical endodontics; and
- Describe methods of treating the urgent/emergent endodontic patients.

Saturday, January 9, 2010 – Day 2: The purpose of Day 2 is to provide hands-on experience with the new instruments, devices, and materials used in non-surgical root canal treatment. New endodontic instruments, materials, and techniques will be demonstrated prior to the hands-on experience in the college's state of the art Simulation Clinic.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this day, participants should be able to:

- Describe the criteria for success and failure and identify potential etiologies of failure;
- Describe principles of access openings and canal location;
- Discuss advantages and disadvantages to current nickel-titanium instruments and the techniques utilized in non-surgical endodontics; and
- Describe obturation used in non-surgical endodontics.

Sunday, January 10, 2010 – Day 3: The purpose of Day 3 is to provide the practitioner experience in developing a differential diagnosis for patients using a case-based format. In addition, common problems and solutions with endodontic anesthesia will be discussed.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this day, participants should be able to:

- Differentiate between pathosis of endodontic origin and non-endodontic disease;
- Describe common fractures occurring in the dentition and treatment options; and
- Discuss the various anesthetic agents and techniques utilized in non-surgical endodontics.
