PROGRAM FACULTY



DR. STEVE ADAIR received his BS (1970) and DDS (1973) degrees from the University of North Carolina. He was awarded a certificate in pediatric dentistry and an MS degree from the University of Iowa College of Dentistry and Dental Clinics in 1976. Dr. Adair taught at Eastman Dental Center for 14 years before moving to the Medical College of Georgia (MCG) in 1990. At MCG he served as chairman of the Department of Pediatric Dentistry from 1990–2009 and directed the pediatric dentistry advanced education program from 1997–2003. After retiring from teaching in September 2009, he served as Chief Dental Officer and as Senior Clinical Affairs Advisor for two Dental Support Organizations. Dr. Adair is a diplomate of the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry, a Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry, and a Fellow of the American College of Dentists. He has served on the Board of Trustees of the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry as a Trustee-at-Large. He has served as Editor-in-Chief of the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry, and editor of Pediatric Dentistry. He has been a member of the Commission on Dental Accreditation, and consultant to the Joint Commission on National Dental Examinations, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, the U.S. Air Force, and several corporations.



DR. HENRY FIELDS is originally from Tipton, Iowa. He graduated from Dartmouth College with a BA. He attended the University of Iowa College of Dentistry and Dental Clinics and was awarded a DDS degree and a masters degree and certificate in pediatric dentistry. He attended the University of Washington and earned an MSD and certificate in orthodontics. Dr. Fields taught for 14 years at the University of North Carolina, where he was a faculty member in Pediatric Dentistry and Orthodontics. He was promoted through the ranks to professor, was the pediatric dentistry graduate program director and Assistant Dean for Academic Affairs. From 1991-2001 Dr. Fields was the Dean at The Ohio State University College of Dentistry. Following that he was the Vig-Williams Endowed Chair of Orthodontics for 14 years. He provides patient care in orthodontics and is Chief of Orthodontics at Nationwide Children's Hospital. Scholarly interests have resulted in approximately 115 papers, two books in multiple editions and numerous book chapters. He serves as a reviewer for: Pediatric Dentistry, the Angle Orthodontist and the American Journal of Orthodontics and Dentofacial Orthopedics. Dr. Fields has served organized dentistry as President of the Columbus Dental Society; President of the Ohio Dental Association and Chair of the for-profit subsidiary; and Vice-chair of the Commission on Dental Accreditation and Chair of the ADA Council of Government Affairs.
