# OPTIMIZING NON-SURGICAL PERIODONTAL THERAPY WITH HANDS-ON WORKSHOP

## THE PROGRAM and OBJECTIVES

**Morning:** Drs. Coleman and Levi will conduct an interactive, in-depth presentation to help participants learn how to provide effective periodontal disease control including a discussion of the steps to be taken for a comprehensive periodontal examination, and accurate probing and calculus detection. They will discuss the etiology of periodontal diseases and motivation of the patient to control plaque, and there will be a discussion on the relationship between periodontitis and systemic diseases. A thorough review of treatment planning and the sequencing of appointments for scaling and root planning will be provided. The rationale for periodontal hand instrumentation will be presented utilizing classical and innovative hand instruments. In addition, there will be a discussion of the use of systemic and local delivery antibiotics as adjuncts in the treatment of periodontitis. A demonstration of air polishing and the step by step non-surgical care for dental implants will be presented.

**Afternoon:** Hands-on diagnostics will be provided using the Kinoshita Dental Model, with a simulated attachment apparatus, for pocket probing and calculus detection accuracy. The correct use of a periodontal probe and thoroughness in detecting subgingival calculus will be emphasized in the hands-on exercises. The hands-on use of periodontal scalers and curettes along with hands-on instrument sharpening using Hu-Friedy diamond sharpening cards will be presented. A comprehensive discussion and hands-on use of magnetostrictive and piezoelectric power scalers will take place; a tip design selection will also be discussed.

**At the completion of this presentation, participants should be able to:**

- Understand the etiology of periodontal diseases,
- Provide ideas for motivating patients,
- Provide ideas for teaching patients the correct techniques for plaque removal,
- Learn how to improve accuracy in periodontal pocket measurement,
- Improve skills in calculus detection,
- Improve skills in scaling and root planning with hand and power instruments, and
- Improve skills in hand instrument sharpening.

## PROGRAM FACULTY

**Paul A. Levi, Jr., DMD,** graduated from Tufts University School of Dental Medicine (TUSDM) in 1966. He completed a dental internship at the Mary Fletcher Hospital in Burlington, Vermont and then served as a dental officer at Great Lakes Naval Training Center in North Chicago, Illinois. After his two years in the service he entered TUSDM for two years of specialty training in periodontology. Upon graduation in 1971, he moved to Burlington, Vermont where he established a practice in periodontology where he continues to practice. Outside of the office, he has taught at the University of Vermont School of Dental Hygiene, Harvard School of Dental Medicine (HSDM) and in the Department of Periodontology at TUSDM. He also spent a year in Barcelona, Spain, where he taught at the Universitat Internacional de Catalunya. Dr. Levi continues to teach part-time in the three dental schools as well as lecture and give workshops in many schools and for many dental organizations throughout the United States and in Europe and Asia.

**Daniel K. Coleman, DMD, MS,** graduated from Tufts University School of Dental Medicine where he also completed his residency in Periodontics. He also completed a Post-Doctoral Master of Science for his work in developing teaching aids for the education of providers. Dr. Coleman is a faculty member at Harvard School of Dental Medicine where he serves as a clinical instructor in the Department of Periodontology. He is the proud author of "Non-Surgical Control of Periodontal Diseases," a textbook used for the education of dental students. Additionally, he is currently the President of the Providence District Dental Society and a recent recipient of Incisal Edge Magazine's 2016, "Top 40 under 40 Dentists".
