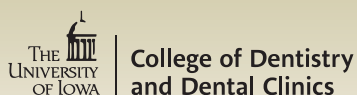

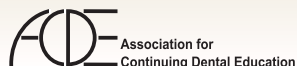

THE PROGRAM and OBJECTIVES

Dr. Schwartz will conduct an interactive, case-based presentation on decision-making and treatment planning for a wide variety of clinical situations. The overall emphasis will be on the role of endodontics in multi-specialty care and how well-planned and well-executed endodontic treatment can improve the outcomes in other areas of dentistry, including restorative dentistry, periodontics and implants. He will present case histories and lead the audience through the thought process of diagnosis, case selection, endodontic considerations, restorative considerations and execution of the treatment. He will show how he treated the patients, discuss his rationale and emphasize the importance of the "patient conversation". He will also discuss the use of "decision points" in treatment planning, risk/benefit/cost analysis, and "special situations." Many long-term recalls will be presented.



At the completion of this presentation, participants should be able to discuss:

- Management of a wide variety of every day endodontic scenarios;
- How endodontic treatment influences the success and failure of restorative dentistry, and how the restorative dentistry affects the outcome of endodontics;
- A logical, organized approach to endodontic treatment planning including "pre-implant endodontics"; and
- How Cone Beam CT has enhanced the decision-making process in endodontics.

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PROGRAM FACULTY

Rick Schwartz, DDS, was a restorative dentist for 19 years prior to entering post-graduate training in endodontics. He attended a two-year general dentistry residency while in the U.S. Air Force, and then did a combination of private practice, teaching and dental materials research before entering endodontic training in 1996. He has authored over 100 articles and abstracts and was a cover author on three editions of *"Fundamentals of Operative Dentistry"* by Quintessence Publishing Co. Since 1998, he has been in full-time private practice limited to endodontics in San Antonio, TX, and has practiced with Dr. Rick Davis since 2001. He teaches part-time in graduate endodontics at the dental school in San Antonio, does a bit of professional writing and has lectured in the United States and 12 other countries.
